Individual Scholarships at Carolinas College of Health Sciences

Carolinas Nursing Endowment Scholarship

The Carolinas Nursing Endowment was established by an anonymous donor and today awards approximately \$4,000 annually. Donations are accepted to this fund on an ongoing basis.

Connie Anderson "Class of 1951" Scholarship

This scholarship was founded in 2004 by a nursing alumnus of the class of '51 in grateful appreciation for what the college and her classmates had done to help the class stay in touch through the years. She treasures her formative years and the lifelong friends she made while attending nursing school. This award is presented to a nursing student who is fluent in a second language.

Elinor Caddell Alumni Scholarship

Elinor Caddell was in the first nursing class at the CMH School of Nursing. She later returned to teach for the school before moving on to UNC-Charlotte. This scholarship was set up to honor Elinor by former classmates and students. This scholarship is awarded to a nursing student planning to pursue baccalaureate Nursing studies after graduating from CCHS.

Friends of CMC Scholarship

Friends of Carolinas Medical Center is a volunteer organization that helps support the hospital by conducting special charity events. Proceeds from these activities were used to endow this scholarship, and it supports all programs at Carolinas College.



George Tillery Scholarship

The George Tillery scholarship was created to honor the memory of COL George Gordon Tillery, a career army aviator. Its purpose is to provide financial support for an individual preparing for a career change after service in the military, so preference is given to those with military service and to former pilots.

Harris Annual Scholarship

The James J. and Angelia M. Harris Foundation funds twelve to eighteen scholarships in Nursing and Radiologic Technology through an annual grant for an overall total of approximately \$50,000 a year. Mr. Harris was a long-time CHS Board member. Together, through both their philanthropy and their service, the Harris' have had an immeasurable impact on human services in the Charlotte area and beyond.

Hollandsworth Scholarship

The Hollandsworth Endowment was established in 1990 by Frances and Ray Shue in honor and loving memory of Ray's step-father and mother, Ray and Rosemary Hollandsworth, both patients at CMC. This award is given to students so that they may make a dramatic difference in the lives of patients and their families.

Irene G. Millroy Community Healthcare Scholarship

It was with great appreciation in 2005 that a gift was received from the estate of Irene G. Millroy, a longtime educator. Seeking to be excellent stewards of the resource given to us, CCHS established the Irene G. Millroy Community Healthcare Scholarship.

Janice Blout Smith Scholarship

Janice Blount Smith was a 1958 graduate from Charlotte Memorial Hospital School of Nursing who passed away in 2003. A friend of hers created this scholarship in her memory.

• Jean Kramer Memorial Scholarship

Mrs. Kramer was a 1964 graduate of Mercy School of Nursing. Her husband established this scholarship in her memory upon her passing in 2005.

Jim and Nancy Hill Scholarship

This scholarship was awarded for the first time in 2008-2009. It was established in honor of Nancy, a 1967 Charlotte Memorial alumnus. Nancy went on to earn her BSN and MSN degrees and worked in public health for many years, where she was highly regarded as a knowledgeable resource, particularly in the communicable disease arena. Nancy and her husband Jim established this scholarship to assist aspiring students to obtain a Nursing education.

Kathy Bruce Core Values Scholarship

Katherine Harrell Bruce graduated from Charlotte Memorial Hospital School of Nursing in 1964. She started her career as a flight nurse for the NJ National Guard. She returned to nursing at Charlotte Memorial Hospital in 1973. Kathy worked at CMC for over 35 years and was known for being one of the last nurses to wear the traditional white uniform and nurse's cap every day until she retired in August 2008. This scholarship was endowed in 2008 in recognition of her retirement and in honor of her co-workers. It is awarded in memory of her sister – Shirley Ann Harrell.



Lynda C. Opdyke Advanced Education MSON Alumni Scholarship

These scholarships were created to repurpose the Mercy endowed student scholarships when MSON closed. Two scholarships are awarded each fall to Mercy School of Nursing alumni who work within Atrium Health and are pursuing advanced education.

Marilyn Gaffney Memorial Scholarship

This award was created in loving memory of Marilyn Gaffney, RN, by her family, friends, and colleagues. Marilyn was the Director of Nursing at CMC-Randolph Behavioral Health Hospital before losing her battle with cancer in 2001. This scholarship honors her long commitment to nursing and nursing education.

Martha Brackett Rollins Scholarship

The Martha Brackett Rollins Scholarship was made possible by gifts from friends and family in memory of Mrs. Rollins, a 1963 graduate of the CMH School of Nursing. She was not only a nurse who never lost her love for helping others, but she was also an accomplished marksman, businesswoman, and entrepreneur. Martha was a devoted wife to Paul and a loving daughter and sister. The Martha Brackett Rollins Scholarship was founded in 2004.

MSON Advanced Education Alumni Scholarship

These scholarships were created to repurpose the Mercy endowed student scholarships when MSON closed. Two scholarships are awarded each fall to Mercy School of Nursing alumni who work within Atrium Health and are pursuing advanced education.

Nell Nurkin Nursing Scholarship

This scholarship is in memory of Nell Webster Nurkin, mother of former Carolinas HealthCare System CEO Harry Nurkin. It was endowed through the generous memorial contributions of her family and friends when she passed away. When possible, the scholarship is awarded to a nursing student who is a single parent, in tribute to Mrs. Nurkin's years as a widow raising several children.

Nursing Advancement Scholarship

The Nursing Advancement Scholarship was provided by an anonymous donor to the Foundation to support nursing education. It is a merit-based award.

This scholarship was created by the McAulay family, providing funding for annual nursing scholarships to provide the greatest impact and value to our students.

Betty Anderson Scholarship

Betty, a native Charlottean, received her bachelor's in biology from UNC-Greensboro and continued her training in medical technology at Bowman Gray Baptist Medical Center. She began her career in the chemistry department at Charlotte Memorial Hospital and became the program director for the School of Clinical Laboratory Sciences in 1978. Betty served in this capacity until her retirement in 2010. This scholarship was established at that time to celebrate Betty's



contributions to the MLS program. This scholarship supports a current clinical laboratory science student.

Betsy Rosemond "Caring" Scholarship

This scholarship recognizes the legacy of Betsy Rosemond, an individual described by all who knew her as "...a giving, loving, people-oriented person who made everyone around her feel good about themselves and good about the world." Its recipient will have demonstrated those same characteristics and has preference for those that live in North Carolina or South Carolina.

Charles U. Mauney Scholarship

Charles Mauney, PhD, was the long-time director of the Microbiology Dept. at CMC and a member of the Charlotte Pathology Group. He was a lecturer in the School of Medical Technology. This scholarship was established in Dr. Mauney's memory in 1997 by his friends and colleagues.

• Daniel John Dubick, II Memorial Scholarship

This memorial scholarship was established in 2020 by Dan's mom to celebrate his life and honor his legacy of lifelong learning, unwavering determination, and endless generosity. Dan passed away unexpectedly in 2019. This scholarship supports students in the Rad-Tech program.

Louis and Jacqueline Pfeiffer Nursing Scholarship

This award was created to support meritorious nursing students attending Carolinas College.

Kathleen Revel, M.D. Nursing Scholarship

Kathleen Revel graduated from Charlotte Memorial Hospital School of Nursing in 1948. This scholarship was created in 2008 by her partner, Dr. Eve Hoover, and supports students that are pursuing an advanced healthcare degree.

• Eve B. Hoover PhD CNA Student Scholarship Endowment

This scholarship was created by Dr. Eve B. Hoover, providing scholarship funding to the Certified Nurse Assistant Program.

• Dr. Greg Parsons Scholarship

Dr. Greg Parsons joined Charlotte Radiology in 1975. In 1986, he became chief of radiology at Carolinas Medical Center and briefly chief of the medical staff before retiring in 2001. During his tenure, Charlotte Radiology grew to become one of the largest and most respected radiology groups in the country. Dr. Parsons was an ardent proponent of education, social justice, and environmental stewardship. This scholarship was established to honor his memory upon his passing in 2011 and supports students in the Rad Tech program.
